Section 2 Hazards Identification

Section 3 Composition/Information on Ingredients

Proprietary mixture of synthetic waxes, additive(s), and oil soluble dye(s). No components are classified as hazardous, and therefore do not need to be disclosed

Section 4 First Aid Measures

Description of first aid measures

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. Call a physician if symptoms develop or persist.

Skin contact: For thermal burns, flush or submerge effected area in cold water to dissipate heat.

Cover with clean bandage material. Do not peel material from skin. Get medical attention.

Eye contact: Rinse immediately with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if

irritation persists after washing.

Ingestion: Rinse mouth. Get medical attention if symptoms occur.

Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

No known significant effects or critical hazards.

Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Burns should be treated as thermal burns. The material will come off as healing occurs; therefore, immediate removal from the skin is not necessary.

Section 5 Fire-Fighting Measures

Extinguishing media

Use extinguishing measures that are appropriate to local circumstances and the surrounding environment.

Water fog. Foam. Dry chemical powder. Carbon dioxide (CO₂).

Do not use water jet as an extinguisher, as this will spread the fire.

Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Watch footing on floors and stairs because of possible spreading of molten material. Material can create slippery conditions. In case of fire hazardous decomposition products may be produced such as: Carbon monoxide, Carbon dioxide (CO_2)



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Section 5 Fire-Fighting Measures

Advice for firefighters

In the event of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and protective suit. No unprotected exposed skin areas.

Section 6 Accidental Release Measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Keep unnecessary personnel away. For personal protection see section 8.

Environmental precautions

Avoid discharge into drains, water courses or onto the ground.

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

For molten product: If material is molten, allow to cool. Use caution, as material may still be hot after solidification. Spilled material will solidify. Allow to solidify. Scrape up. Shovel into suitable container for disposal.

Section 7 Handling and Storage

Precautions for safe handling

Avoid prolonged exposure. Observe good industrial hygiene practices. Avoid contact with molten material. Do not breathe fumes, vapors, dust or sprays from molten or burning material. Avoid heating above 212°F (100°C) during the normal investment casting process (except dewax operations). If processing at >600°F (315°C), consider use of a respirator to avoid breathing decomposition products. Avoid generating dust.

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Keep in a dry, cool and well-ventilated place. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Keep away from direct sunlight. Protect from physical damage. Store away from incompatible substances.

Appropriate engineering controls

Good general ventilation (typically 10 air changes per hour) should be used. Ventilation rates should be matched to conditions. Supplementary local exhaust ventilation, closed systems, or respiratory and eye protection may be needed in special circumstances, such as poorly ventilated spaces, very hot processing, mechanical generation of dusts, etc.

Personal protective equipment (PPE)

Eye/face protection Wear safety glasses with side shields, or goggles.

Skin protection: Prevent skin contact. Wear appropriate gloves and clothing.

Wear appropriate thermal protective clothing, when necessary.

Respiratory protection: In case of insufficient ventilation, wear suitable respiratory equipment. For limited exposure use an N95 dust mask. For prolonged exposure use an air-purifying respirator with high efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filters. Follow the OSHA respirator regulations found in 29 CFR 1910.134 or European Standard EN 149. Use a NIOSH/MSHA or European Standard EN 149 approved respirator if exposure limits are exceeded or symptoms are experienced.
